# YEAR IN REVIEW

My first year as president of Discovery Green has been filled with countless moments of transformational connection with culture and community.

It has been my privilege to work with the incredibly talented Conservancy staff and Board of Directors. Together, we've produced over 500 free events that showcase the true heart of Houston cultural and performing arts. Our work – alongside our partners Houston First and Downtown Houston Plus – has welcomed visitors with the often surprising and complex diversity of traditions that makes the city so vibrant.

This year Discovery Green has once again re-imagined what public spaces are capable of with the launch of Art Lab – a groundbreaking mentorship program for Houston artists who desire to break into interactive public art. The program is co-created with Weingarten Arts Group and guided by input from the Public Art Committee.

With Art Lab, Discovery Green aims to support local artists, foster diversity and spur innovation within our community. The program provides Houston artists opportunities to build skills and access the resources needed to build large-scale, interactive, three-dimensional public art.

Since 2014, Discovery Green has engaged artists from around the world to create site-specific, interactive, public artworks. Through this experience, the Conservancy discovered that Houstonians have a passion for public art that inspires, connects and engages. This is only the beginning for this innovative program.

From my very first day at Discovery Green, I had a vision of the park's future rooted in art and technology that engages visitors and inspires new avenues of exploration.

Art Lab's impact is already being felt in the community with the launch of PRISM, a dynamic group of annual supporters of Discovery Green Conservancy's arts programming. With eight new donors, the program has already reached its first fundraising goals with more to come! These like-minded supporters are dedicated to ensuring the park's arts programming remains freely accessible to all.

That community support is vital to Discovery Green's magic and its egalitarian nature. Houston is only able to remain strong and resilient because of vibrant public spaces like Discovery Green that renew, rebuild and replenish our community.

From my very first day at Discovery Green, I had a vision of the park's future rooted in art and technology that engages visitors and inspires new avenues of exploration. As part of this vision, I gave Susanne Theis the role of Artistic Director. Susanne previously served as Programming Director at Discovery Green and before that was the Executive Director of the Orange Show. Susanne has been a hero of mine since early 2000s because of her creative genius. With this new role, she committed to delaying her planned retirement so that she may lead with me and help build upon her incredible legacy.

The second major leadership decision I made was to make Jose Leal, who was serving as the Finance and Admin Director, the new Chief Operating Officer. Jose now oversees the day-to-day operations of the park and works with me to ensure the fiscal health of the Conservancy. Jose has over 20 years' experience in nonprofit management, and I look to him as my partner in administrative decision-making.

Being president of Discovery Green has been one of the greatest highlights of my career and I couldn't be prouder. The love that Houston has for Discovery Green has been a privilege to witness. I know that with your continued support this uncommonly beautiful green space will bloom for many years to come.
